



How to Apply*

- Children must be 3 or 4 years old by August 15.
- Families must meet federal income guidelines.
- Applications for enrollment are taken all year.
- Enrollment opportunities are available for children with disabilities.
- Children do not have to be potty-trained.

What we offer

School Readiness

The program promotes language and reading skills, socialization and emotional development, learning skills, math and science knowledge and practice with fine & gross motor skills.

Health Services

Every child receives the following screenings: blood lead level, blood pressure, developmental screening, health history, hearing screening, physical exam, speech, vision, and growth assessment. We can assist families with transportation to their child's medical appointments, applying for insurance coverage, and establishing medical and dental provider homes.


Nutrition

What we offer

Disability

Our program extends services to children with disabilities. Those include, but are not limited to, epilepsy, cerebral palsy, developmental delays, emotional or behavioral disorders, autism, learning disabilities, traumatic brain injuries, as well as health, hearing, speech, language, visual, and orthopedic impairments.



Social Services

Our program offers support to families in achieving goals such as housing stability, continuing education, reading skills, financial planning workshops, and employment readiness training.

Family Engagement

Our program works with families as equal partners to support children's ongoing development and learning. HeadStart parents, guardians or family members can serve as volunteers in the classroom. Volunteers are used to read stories to children, help with art projects, supervise children on the playground and on field trips.
